Matthew 10:20 (NASB)

20 For it is not you who speak, <u>but</u> it is the Spirit of your Father who speaks in you.

For it is not you who will speak, but the spirit of your Father will speak through you.

Mark 13:11 (NASB)

11 When they arrest you and hand you over, do not worry beforehand about what you are to say, but say whatever is given you in that hour; for it is not you who speak, but it is the Holy Spirit.

Mark 13:11


When they come to arrest you and put you on trial, do not worry about what to say. Just say what you are told at that time, because it will not be you speaking, but the holy spirit.

Luke 12:12 (NASB)

12 for the Holy Spirit will teach you in that very hour what you ought to say."

The holy spirit will teach you at that time what you need to say."



Matthew 12:18(NASB)

"Behold, My Servant whom I have chosen;
My Beloved in whom My soul is wellpleased;
I will put My Spirit upon Him,
And He shall proclaim justice to the

Gentiles.

"This is my servant whom I have chosen, the one I love, who pleases me. I will put My spirit on him, and he will tell the foreigners what is right.




Matthew 12:28 (NASB)

28 But if I cast out demons by the Spirit of God, then the kingdom of God has come upon you.

But if I am throwing out demons through the power of the spirit of God, then the Kingdom of God has come to you!



Matthew 22:43-44 (NASB)

43 He *said to them, "Then how does David in the Spirit call Him 'Lord,' saying,
44 'The Lord said to my Lord,
"Sit at My right hand,
Until I put Your enemies beneath Your feet"?

Matthew 22:43-44

Jesus then asked them, "But how then can <u>David under inspiration call him</u> '<u>lord'?</u> David says, 44' The Lord said to my lord, sit down at my right hand until I defeat all your enemies.'


Mark 12:36 (NASB)

Luke 1:41 (NASB)

41 When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leaped in her womb; and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit.

Luke 1:67 (NASB)


67 And his father Zacharias was filled with the Holy Spirit, and prophesied, saying:

Luke 2:25 (NASB)

25 And there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; and this man was righteous and devout, looking for the consolation of Israel; and the Holy Spirit was upon him.

Living in Jerusalem at that time was a man called Simeon. Simeon lived uprightly and was very devout. He was waiting expectantly for the consolation and restoration of Israel, and the holy spirit was upon him.



Luke 2:26 (NASB)

26 And it had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ.

It had been revealed to him through the holy spirit that he would not die before he saw the Lord's Messiah.




Luke 4:14 (NASB)

14 And Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news about Him spread through all the surrounding district.

Luke 4:14

Jesus returned to Galilee, fully empowered by the spirit. News about him spread everywhere.



Luke 11:13 (NASB)

13 If you then, being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him?"

Luke 11:13

So if you, even as the evil persons you are, still know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give holy spirit to those who ask him?"



God's spirit is His influence, presence, and power at work accomplishing His will in the universe in general and in among His people in particular.



This empowerment made possible the miracles recorded throughout the Hebrew Scriptures as well as in the Gospels. For example, Jesus himself plainly stated God's spirit empowered him to drive out demons:



Matthew 12:28

But if I cast out demons by the <u>spirit of God</u>, then the kingdom of God has come upon you.



Luke 11:20

But if I cast out demons by the <u>finger of God</u>, then the kingdom of God has come upon you. This simple equation, "the spirit of God = the finger of God," marvelously supports what we have already found—the spirit is the means by which God acts, much like a body.



I interact with the world through my body. God interacts with the world through His spirit—like a finger. All of what Christ was able to do was a result of the anointing of God's spirit.

Peter put it this way, "You know of Jesus of Nazareth, how God anointed him with the holy spirit and with power, and how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by devil, for God was with him" (Acts 10:38).
