





of the Spirit mean?






In the process of redemption, after the Holy Spirit convicts the world of sin, He draws the soul(Person) to Christ and salvation, imparting faith as a gift of the Spirit. The faith allows the soul(Person) to see their guilt of sin and turn from sin (repentance), asking God to forgive their sins, through the blood of Christ.



Through the death of Christ, the sins of the repentant sinner are paid for on the cross, they are declared Justified before God, on account of Christ. The Holy Spirit then enters the new believer and is deposited as a guarantee. The soul is a new creation before God, Born Again, justified in Christ.



With the Holy Spirit dwelling in us, our bodies become Literally, the Temple of God. We are now Separated, from this world, because God has taken residence with us, we are restored to God. We are the purchased possession of Christ, whose blood paid for our sins.


hagios: sacred, holy



Short Definition: might, power, marvelous works


Definition: (a) physical power, force, might, ability, efficacy, energy, meaning (b) plur: powerful deeds, deeds showing (physical) power, marvelous works.

²⁶ In the same way the Spirit also helps our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we should, but the Spirit Himself intercedes for *us* with groanings too deep for words; ²⁷ and He who searches the hearts knows what the mind of the Spirit is, because He intercedes for the saints according to *the will of God*.
