Death Is Unconsciousness

"His spirit departs, he returns to the earth; In that very day his thoughts perish." Psalms 146:4 NASB

Ecclesiastes 9:5-6

5)For the living know they will die; but the dead do not know anything, nor have they any longer a reward, for their memory is forgotten. 6)Indeed their love, their hate and their zeal have already perished, and they will no longer have a share in all that is done under the sun."

Ecclesiastes 9:10

No thinking and therefore no consciousness.

"Whatever your hand finds to do, do it with all your might; for there is no activity or planning or knowledge or wisdom in Sheol where you are going." Ecclesiastes 9:10 NASB God remembers that we are dust. As for man, his days are as grass: as a flower of the field, so he flourisheth...it is gone; and the place thereof shall know it no more.

PSALMS 103:14-16

14)For He Himself knows our frame; He is mindful that we are but dust. 15)As for man, his days are like grass; As a flower of the field, so he flourishes." Psalms 103:14-15 NASB "When the wind has passed over it, it is no more, And its place acknowledges it no longer." Psalms 103:16 NASB

Death is truly unconsciousness, even for the righteous, is demonstrated by the repeated pleas of God's servants to allow their lives to be lengthened, because they knew that after death they would be unable to praise and glorify God seeing that death was a state of unconsciousness.

18)For Sheol cannot thank You, Death cannot praise You; Those who go down to the pit cannot hope for Your faithfulness. 19)It is the living who give thanks to You, as I do today; A father tells his sons about Your faithfulness." Isaiah 38:18-19 NASB

"Return, O LORD, rescue my soul; Save me because of Your lovingkindness. For there is no mention of You in death; In Sheol who will give You thanks?" Psalms 6:4-5 NASB

"What profit is there in my blood, if I go down to the pit? Will the dust praise You? Will it declare Your faithfulness?" Psalms 30:9 NASB

"Turn Your gaze away from me, that I may smile again Before I depart and am no more.""
Psalms 39:13 NASB

17)The dead do not praise the LORD, Nor do any who go down into silence; 18)But as for us, we will bless the LORD From this time forth and forever. Praise the LORD!" Psalms 115:17-18 NASB

Death is repeatedly referred to as a sleep or rest, both for the righteous and the wicked. (Job 3:11,13,17) (Daniel 12:13)

"Why did I not die at birth, Come forth from the womb and expire?" Job 3:11 NASB "For now I would have lain down and been quiet; I would have slept then, I would have been at rest," Job 3:13 NASB "There the wicked cease from raging, And there the weary are at rest." Job 3:17 NASB "But as for you, go your way to the end; then you will enter into rest and rise again for your allotted portion at the end of the age."" Daniel 12:13 NASB

The true doctrine of death and man's nature provides a great sense of peace. After all the traumas and pains of a man's life, the grave is a place of total oblivion. For those who have not known the requirements of God, this oblivion will last for ever.

Oblivion- the state of being unaware or unconscious of what is happening.

THE RESURRECTION

The Bible emphasizes that the reward of the righteous will be at the resurrection, at the coming of Christ

1 Thessalonians 4:16

"For the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first." 1 Thessalonians 4:16 NASB

The resurrection of the responsible dead will be the first thing Christ will do; this will be followed by the judgement. Paul said that if there is no resurrection, then all effort to be obedient to God is pointless

1 Corinthians 15:32

"If from human motives I fought with wild beasts at Ephesus, what does it profit me? If the dead are not raised, LET US EAT AND DRINK, FOR TOMORROW WE DIE." 1 Corinthians 15:32 NASB

Paul would not have reasoned like this if he believed that he would also be rewarded with his 'soul' going to heaven at death.He believed the resurrection of the body to be the only form of reward.

The whole of 1 Corinthians 15 speaks in detail of the resurrection; it will always repay careful reading.

1 Corinthians 15:33-44

35)But someone will say, "How are the dead raised? And with what kind of body do they come?" 36)You fool! That which you sow does not come to life unless it dies;" 1 Corinthians 15:35-36 NASB

37) and that which you sow, you do not sow the body which is to be, but a bare grain, perhaps of wheat or of something else. 38)But God gives it a body just as He wished, and to each of the seeds a body of its own." 1 Corinthians 15:37-38 NASB

39)All flesh is not the same flesh, but there is one flesh of men, and another flesh of beasts, and another flesh of birds, and another of fish. 40)There are also heavenly bodies and earthly bodies, but the glory of the heavenly is one, and the glory of the earthly is another." 1 Corinthians 15:39-40 NASB

41)There is one glory of the sun, and another glory of the moon, and another glory of the stars; for star differs from star in glory. 42)So also is the resurrection of the dead. It is sown a perishable body, it is raised an imperishable body;" 1 Corinthians 15:41-42 NASB

43) it is sown in dishonor, it is raised in glory; it is sown in weakness, it is raised in power; 44) it is sown a natural body, it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a natural body, there is also a spiritual body." 1 Corinthians 15:43-44 NASB

Christ rose from the grave and had is mortal body changed to an immortalized body, so the true believer will share his reward.

PHILIPPIANS 3:21 ROMANS 8:11 JOHN 6:43-44

"who will transform the body of our humble state into conformity with the body of His glory, by the exertion of the power that He has even to subject all things to Himself." Philippians 3:21 NASB

"But if the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, He who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through His Spirit who dwells in you." Romans 8:11 NASB

43) Jesus answered and said to them, "Do not grumble among yourselves. 44)No one can come to Me unless the Father who sent Me draws him; and I will raise him up on the last day." John 6:43-44 NASB

1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

Those who died in Christ

13)But we do not want you to be uninformed, brethren, about those who are asleep, so that you will not grieve as do the rest who have no hope. 14)For if we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so God will bring with Him those who have fallen asleep in Jesus." 1 Thessalonians 4:13-14 NASB

15)For this we say to you by the word of the Lord, that we who are alive and remain until the coming of the Lord, will not precede those who have fallen asleep. 16)For the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first." 1 Thessalonians 4:15-16 NASB

17) Then we who are alive and remain will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air, and so we shall always be with the Lord. 18)Therefore comfort one another with these words." 1 Thessalonians 4:17-18 NASB

"He that raised up Christ from the dead shall also quicken your mortal bodies by his Spirit" (Rom. 8:11).

"But if the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, He who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through His Spirit who dwells in you." Romans 8:11 NASB

With this hope, we therefore wait for "the redemption of our body" (Rom. 8:23), through that body being immortalized.

"And not only this, but also we ourselves, having the first fruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, waiting eagerly for our adoption as sons, the redemption of our body. Romans 8:23 NASB

At his return, Christ "shall change our vile body, that it may be fashioned like unto his glorious body" (Phil. 3:20,21).

Philippians 3:20-21 NASB
