Job 32

1 So these three men ceased to answer Job, because he was righteous in his own eyes. 2 Then was kindled the wrath of Elihu the son of Barachel the Buzite, of the kindred of Ram: against Job was his wrath kindled, because he justified himself rather than Elohim. all help them, and

3 Also against his three friends was his wrath kindled, because they had found no answer, and yet had condemned Job.

4 Now Elihu had waited till Job had spoken, because they were elder than he. advation of the righteous is

5 When Elihu saw that there was no answer in the mouth of these three men, then his wrath was kindled. 6 And Elihu the son of Barachel the Buzite answered and said, I am young, and ye are very old; wherefore I was afraid, and durst not shew you mine opinion.

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- 7 I said, Days should speak, and multitude of years should teach wisdom.
- 8 But there is a spirit in man: and the inspiration of the Almighty giveth them understanding.
- 9 Great men are not always wise: neither do the aged understand judgment.

- 18 For I am full of matter, the spirit within me constraineth me.

19 Behold, my belly is as wine which hath no vent; it is ready to burst like new bottles. 20 I will speak, that I may be refreshed: I will open my lips and answer.

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21 Let me not, I pray you, accept any man's person, neither let me give flattering titles unto man. 22 For I know not to give flattering titles; in so doing my maker would soon take me away.

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Job 33

- 1 Wherefore, Job, I pray thee, hear my speeches, and hearken to all my words.
 - 2 Behold, now I have opened my mouth, my tongue hath spoken in my mouth.

3 My words shall be of the uprightness of my heart: and my lips shall utter knowledge clearly.

4 The Spirit of El hath made me, and the breath of the Almighty hath given me life.

5 If thou canst answer me, set thy words in order before me, stand up.

- 6 Behold, I am according to thy wish in El's stead: I also am formed out of the clay.
 - 7 Behold, my terror shall not make thee afraid, neither shall my hand be heavy upon thee.
 - 8 Surely thou hast spoken in mine hearing, and I have heard the voice of thy words, saying,

- 9 I am clean without transgression, I am innocent; neither is there iniquity in me.
 - 10 Behold, he findeth occasions against me, he counteth me for his enemy,
- 11 He putteth my feet in the stocks, he marketh all my paths.

- 12 Behold, in this thou art not just: I will answer thee, that Eloah is greater than man.
- 13 Why dost thou strive against him? for he giveth not account of any of his matters.
 - 14 For El speaketh once, yea twice, yet man perceiveth it not.

15 In a dream, in a vision of the night, when deep sleep falleth upon men, in slumberings upon the bed; 16 Then he openeth the ears of men, and sealeth their instruction, 17 That he may withdraw man from his purpose, and hide pride from man. Watton of the righteous of the Lord shall help time of trouble thall deliver them from the mean, and deliver they true to the time them.

- 18 He keepeth back his soul from the pit, and his life from perishing by the sword.
- 19 He is chastened also with pain upon his bed, and the multitude of his bones with strong pain:
- 20 So that his life abhorreth bread, and his soul dainty meat.

- 21 His flesh is consumed away, that it cannot be seen; and his bones that were not seen stick out.
 - 22 Yea, his soul draweth near unto the grave, and his life to the destroyers.
- 23 If there be a messenger with him, an interpreter, one among a thousand, to shew unto man his uprightness:

24 Then he is gracious unto him, and saith, Deliver him from going down to the pit: I have found a ransom.25 His flesh shall be fresher than a child's: he shall return to the days of his youth:

26 He shall pray unto Eloah, and he will be favourable unto him: and he shall see his face with joy: for he will render unto man his righteousness.

- 27 He looketh upon men, and if any say, I have sinned, and perverted that which was right, and it profited me not;
 - 28 He will deliver his soul from going into the pit, and his life shall see the light.
 - 29 Lo, all these *things* worketh El oftentimes with man,

- 30 To bring back his soul from the pit, to be enlightened with the light of the living.
 - 31 Mark well, O Job, hearken unto me: hold thy peace, and I will speak.

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- 32 If thou hast any thing to say, answer me: speak, for I desire to justify thee.
- 33 If not, hearken unto me: hold thy peace, and I shall teach thee wisdom.

Job 34

- 1 Furthermore Elihu answered and said,
- 2 Hear my words, 0 ye wise *men*; and give ear unto me, ye that have knowledge.
 - 3 For the ear trieth words, as the mouth tasteth meat.

- 4 Let us choose to us judgment: let us know among ourselves what *is* good.
- 5 For Job hath said, I am righteous: and El hath taken away my judgment.
 - 6 Should I lie against my right? my wound *is* incurable without transgression.

- 7 What man *is* like Job, *who* drinketh up scorning like water?
 8 Which goeth in company with the workers of iniquity, and walketh with wicked men.
- 9 For he hath said, It profiteth a man nothing that he should delight himself with Elohim.

- 10 Therefore hearken unto me, ye men of understanding: far be it from El, that he should do wickedness; and from the Almighty, that he should commit iniquity.
- 11 For the work of a man shall he render unto him, and cause every man to find according to his ways.
 - 12 Yea, surely El will not do wickedly, neither will the Almighty pervert judgment.

13 Who hath given him a charge over the earth? or who hath disposed the whole world? 14 If he set his heart upon man, if he gather unto himself his spirit and his breath;

15 All flesh shall perish together, and man shall turn again unto dust.

- 16 If now thou hast understanding, hear this: hearken to the voice of my words.
- 17 Shall even he that hateth right govern? and wilt thou condemn him that is most just?
- 18 Is it fit to say to a king, Thou art wicked? and to princes, Ye are unrighteous?

19 How much less to him that accepteth not the persons of princes, nor regardeth the rich more than the poor? for they all are the work of his hands.

20 In a moment shall they die, and the people shall be troubled at midnight, and pass away: and the mighty shall be taken away without hand.

21 For his eyes are upon the ways of man, and he seeth all his goings. 22 There is no darkness, nor shadow of death, where the workers of iniquity may hide themselves. 23 For he will not lay upon man more than right; that he should enter into judgment with El. 24 He shall break in pieces mighty men without number, and set others in their stead.

25 Therefore he knoweth their works, and he overturneth *them* in the night, so that they are destroyed.

26 He striketh them as wicked men in the open sight of others;

- 27 Because they turned back from him, and would not consider any of his ways:
- 28 So that they cause the cry of the poor to come unto him, and he heareth the cry of the afflicted. the Lord shall help them, and decause they truet; on the

29 When he giveth quietness, who then can make trouble? and when he hideth his face, who then can behold him? whether it be done against a nation, or against a man only: 30 That the hypocrite reign not, lest the people be ensnared. 31 Surely it is meet to be said unto El, I have borne chastisement, I will not offend any more:

32 That which I see not teach thou me: if I have done iniquity, I will do no more.

33 Should it be according to thy mind? he will recompense it, whether thou refuse, or whether thou choose; and not I: therefore speak what thou knowest.

34 Let men of understanding tell me, and let a wise man hearken unto me.

Job hath spoken without knowledge, and his words were without wisdom.

- 36 My desire is that Job may be tried unto the end because of his answers for wicked men.
- 37 For he addeth rebellion unto his sin, he clappeth his hands among us, and multiplieth his words against El.

Job 35

- 1 Elihu spake moreover, and said, 2 Thinkest thou this to be right, that thou saidst, My righteousness is more than El's?
 - 3 For thou saidst, What advantage will it be unto thee? and, What profit shall I have, if I be cleansed from my sin?

- 4 I will answer thee, and thy companions with thee.
- 5 Look unto the heavens, and see; and behold the clouds which are higher than thou.
- 6 If thou sinnest, what doest thou against him? or *if* thy transgressions be multiplied, what doest thou unto him?

- 7 If thou be righteous, what givest thou him? or what receiveth he of thine hand?
- 8 Thy wickedness may hurt a man as thou art; and thy righteousness may profit the son of man.
- 9 By reason of the multitude of oppressions they make the oppressed to cry: they cry out by reason of the arm of the mighty.

- 10 But none saith, Where *is* Eloah my maker, who giveth songs in the night;

13 Surely El will not hear vanity, neither will the Almighty regard it. 14 Although thou sayest thou shalt not see him, yet judgment is before him; therefore trust thou in him. 15 But now, because it is not so, he hath visited in his anger; yet he knoweth it not in great extremity: he Loke shall help time of trouble.

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16 Therefore doth Job open his mouth in vain; he multiplieth words without knowledge.

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Job 36

- 1 Elihu also proceeded, and said,
 2 Suffer me a little, and I will shew
 thee that *I have* yet to speak on
 Eloah's behalf.
- 3 I will fetch my knowledge from afar, and will ascribe righteousness to my Maker.

- 4 For truly my words shall not be false: he that is perfect in knowledge is with thee.
- 5 Behold, El is mighty, and despiseth not any: he is mighty in strength and wisdom.
- 6 He preserveth not the life of the wicked: but giveth right to the poor.

- 7 He withdraweth not his eyes from the righteous: but with kings are they on the throne; yea, he doth establish them for ever, and they are exalted.
- 8 And if they be bound in fetters, and be holden in cords of affliction;
 9 Then he sheweth them their work, and their transgressions that they have exceeded.

- 10 He openeth also their ear to discipline, and commandeth that they return from iniquity.
- 11 If they obey and serve *him*, they shall spend their days in prosperity, and their years in pleasures.
- 12 But if they obey not, they shall perish by the sword, and they shall die without knowledge.

- 13 But the hypocrites in heart heap up wrath: they cry not when he bindeth them.
- 14 They die in youth, and their life is among the unclean.
- 15 He delivereth the poor in his affliction, and openeth their ears in oppression.

16 Even so would he have removed thee out of the strait into a broad place, where there is no straitness; and that which should be set on thy table should be full of fatness. 17 But thou hast fulfilled the judgment of the wicked: judgment and justice take hold on thee. the Lord shall help them, and decause they trust in h: the right cause they trust in h:

- 18 Because there is wrath, beware lest he take thee away with his stroke: then a great ransom cannot deliver thee.
 - 19 Will he esteem thy riches? *no*, not gold, nor all the forces of strength.
 - 20 Desire not the night, when people are cut off in their place.

- 21 Take heed, regard not iniquity: for this hast thou chosen rather than affliction.
- 22 Behold, El exalteth by his power: who teacheth like him?
 - 23 Who hath enjoined him his way? or who can say, Thou hast wrought iniquity?

- 24 Remember that thou magnify his work, which men behold.
 - 25 Every man may see it; man may behold *it* afar off.
- 26 Behold, El *is* great, and we know him not, neither can the number of his years be searched out.

27 For he maketh small the drops of water: they pour down rain according to the vapour thereof: 28 Which the clouds do drop and distil upon man abundantly. 29 Also can any understand the spreadings of the clouds, or the noise of his tabernacle? the Lord shall help time of trouble. Job 37

- 1 At this also my heart trembleth, and is moved out of his place.
- 2 Hear attentively the noise of his voice, and the sound that goeth out of his mouth.
 - 3 He directeth it under the whole heaven, and his lightning unto the ends of the earth.

4 After it a voice roareth: he thundereth with the voice of his excellency; and he will not stay them when his voice is heard. 5 El thundereth marvellously with his voice; great things doeth he, which we cannot comprehend. ation of the righteous is o

he Lord shall help them, and decause they trust is

- 6 For he saith to the snow, Be thou on the earth; likewise to the small rain, and to the great rain of his strength.
 - 7 He sealeth up the hand of every man; that all men may know his work.
- 8 Then the beasts go into dens, and remain in their places.

- 9 Out of the south cometh the whirlwind: and cold out of the north.
- 10 By the breath of El frost is given: and the breadth of the waters is straitened.
- 11 Also by watering he wearieth the thick cloud: he scattereth his bright cloud:

- 12 And it is turned round about by his counsels: that they may do whatsoever he commandeth them upon the face of the world in the earth.
- 13 He causeth it to come, whether for correction, or for his land, or for mercy.
 - 14 Hearken unto this, O Job: stand still, and consider the wondrous works of El.

15 Dost thou know when Eloah disposed them, and caused the light of his cloud to shine? 16 Dost thou know the balancings of the clouds, the wondrous works of him which is perfect in knowledge? 17 How thy garments are warm, when he quieteth the earth by the south wind? - 18 Hast thou with him spread out the sky, which is strong, and as a molten looking glass?
- 19 Teach us what we shall say unto him; for we cannot order our speech by reason of darkness.
 - 20 Shall it be told him that I speak? if a man speak, surely he shall be swallowed up.
