Chapter 13)Abram shows selflessness in Faith giving Lot first choice of the Land

Gen 13:1 And Abram went up from Mitsrayim into the South, he and his wife and all that he had, and Lot with him.

Gen 13:2 And Abram was very rich in livestock, in silver, and in gold.

Gen 13:3 And he went on his journey from the South as far as Běyth Ěl, to the place where his tent had been at the beginning, between Běyth Ěl and Ai,

Gen 13:4 to the place of the slaughter-place which he had made there at first. And there Abram called on the Name of יהוה. Gen 13:5 Now Lot, who went with Abram, also had flocks and herds and tents. Gen 13:6 And the land was not able to bear them, that they might dwell together, for their possessions were great, so that they could not dwell together.

Gen 13:7 And there was strife between the herdsmen of Abram's livestock and the herdsmen of Lot's livestock. And at that time the Kena'anites and the Perizzites dwelt in the land.

Gen 13:8 Then Abram said to Lot, "Let there be no strife between you and me, and between my herdsmen and your herdsmen, for we are brothers.

Gen 13:9 "Is not all the land before you? Please separate from me. If you take the left, then I go to the right; or, if you go to the right, then I go to the left."

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Rom 12:18 If possible, on your part, be at peace with all men.

Gen 13:10 And Lot lifted his eyes and saw all the plain of the Yarden, that it was well watered everywhere - before יהוה destroyed Sedom and Amorah - like the garden of יהוה, like the land of Mitsrayim as you go toward Tso'ar. Gen 13:11 So Lot chose for himself all the plain of the Yarden, and Lot moved east. Thus they separated from each other,

Gen 13:12 Abram dwelling in the land of Kena'an, and Lot dwelling in the cities of the plain and pitched his tent as far as Sedom.

Gen 13:13 But the men of Sedom were evil and sinned before יהוה, exceedingly so. Gen 13:14 And after Lot had separated from him, said to Abram, "Now lift up your eyes and look from the place where you are, northward and southward and eastward and westward, Gen 13:15 for all the land which you see I shall give to you and your seed forever.

Gen 13:16 "And I shall make your seed as the dust of the earth, so that, if a man could count the dust of the earth, then your seed also could be counted. Gen 13:17 "Arise, walk in the land through its length and its width, for I give it to you." Gen 13:18 So Abram moved his tent, and went and dwelt by the terebinth trees of Mamre, which are in Hebron, and built a slaughter-place there to יהוה.

Chapter 14) Four Kings against Five, Malki-Tzaddik introduced

Gen 14:1 And it came to be in the days of Amraphel sovereign of Shin'ar, Aryok sovereign of Ellasar, Kedorla'omer sovereign of Ěylam, and Tid'al sovereign of Goyim,

Gen 14:2 that they fought against Bera sovereign of Sedom, Birsha sovereign of Amorah, Shinab sovereign of Admah, Shem'eber sovereign of Tseboyim, and the sovereign of Bela, that is Tso'ar.

Gen 14:3 All these joined together in the Valley of Siddim, that is the Salt Sea.

Gen 14:4 Twelve years they served Kedorla'omer, and in the thirteenth year they rebelled. Gen 14:5 And in the fourteenth year Kedorla'omer and the sovereigns that were with him came and struck the Repha'im in Ashteroth Qarnayim, and the Zuzim in Ham, and the Emites in Shaweh Qiryathayim,

Gen 14:6 and the Horites in their mountain of Se'ir, as far as El Paran, which is by the wilderness.

Gen 14:7 And they turned back and came to En Mishpat, that is Qadesh, and struck all the country of the Amaleqites, and also the Amorites who dwelt in Hatsetson Tamar. Gen 14:8 And the sovereign of Sedom, and the sovereign of Amorah, and the sovereign of Admah, and the sovereign of Tseboyim, and the sovereign of Bela, that is Tso'ar, went out and joined together in battle in the Valley of Siddim,

Gen 14:9 against Kedorla'omer sovereign of Ěylam, and Tid'al sovereign of Goyim, and Amraphel sovereign of Shin'ar, and Aryok sovereign of Ellasar - four sovereigns against five. Gen 14:10 And the Valley of Siddim had many tar pits. And the sovereigns of Sedom and Amorah fled and fell there, and the remainder fled to the mountains.

Gen 14:11 And they took all the goods of Sedom and Amorah, and all their food, and went away. Gen 14:12 And they took Lot, Abram's brother's son who dwelt in Sedom, and his goods, and left.

Gen 14:13 And one who had escaped came and informed Abram the Hebrew, for he dwelt by the terebinth trees of Mamre the Amorite, brother of Eshkol and brother of Aner, and they had a covenant with Abram. Gen 14:14 And when Abram heard that his brother was taken captive, he armed his three hundred and eighteen trained servants who were born in his own house, and went in pursuit as far as Dan.

Gen 14:15 And he and his servants divided against them by night, and struck them and pursued them as far as Hobah, which is on the left of Dammeseq. Gen 14:16 So he brought back all the goods, and also brought back his brother Lot and his goods, as well as the women and the people. Gen 14:17 And after his return from the striking of Kedorla'omer and the sovereigns who were with him, the sovereign of Sedom came out to meet him at the Valley of Shawen, that is, the Sovereign's Valley.

Gen 14:18 And Malkitsedeq sovereign of Shalem brought out bread and wine. Now he was the priest of the Most High E.

Gen 14:19 And he blessed him and said, "Blessed be Abram of the Most High El, Possessor of the heavens and earth.

Gen 14:20 "And blessed be the Most High El who has delivered your enemies into your hand." And he gave him a tenth of all. Messiah through Abraham Messiah through Lot Messiah through Malkitsedeq Messiah through Judah Gen 14:21 And the sovereign of Sedom said to Abram, "Give me the people, and take the goods for yourself."

Gen 14:22 But Abram said to the sovereign of Sedom, "I have lifted my hand to יהוה, the Most High Ěl, the Possessor of the heavens and earth, Gen 14:23 not to take a thread or a sandal strap or whatever is yours, lest you should say, 'I have made Abram rich,'

Gen 14:24 except only what the young men have eaten, and the portion of the men who went with me: Aněr, Eshkol, and Mamrě. Let them take their portion." Heb 7:4 Now see how great this one was, to whom even the ancestor Abraham gave a tenth of the choicest booty.

Heb 7:5 And truly, those who are of the sons of Lewi, who receive the priesthood, have a command to receive tithes from the people according to the Torah, that is, from their brothers, though they have come from the loins of Abraham, Heb 7:6 however, the one whose genealogy is not derived from them received tithes from Abraham, and blessed the one who held the promises.
Heb 7:7 And it is beyond all dispute that the lesser is blessed by the better.

Heb 7:9 And one might say that through Abraham even Léwi, who received tithes, gave tithes,
Heb 7:10 for he was still in the loins of his father when Malkitsedeq met him.

Heb 7:11 Truly, then, if perfection were through the Léwitical priesthood - for under it the people were given the Torah - why was there still need for another priest to arise according to the order of Malkitsedeq, and not be called according to the order of Aharon? Heb 7.12 For the priesthood being changed, of

necessity there takes place a change of law also.
