

Acts 12:1-4 (KJV)

1 Now about that time Herod the king stretched forth his hands to vex certain of the church.2 And he killed James the brother of John with the sword.

3 And because he saw it pleased the Jews, he proceeded further to take Peter also. (Then were the days of unleavened bread.)



4 And when he had apprehended him, he put him in prison, and delivered him to four quaternions of soldiers to keep him; intending after Easter to bring him forth to the people.

In this teaching we will be focusing on the history of Easter, exploring its disturbing undeniable Pagan roots.



We will explore exactly when the holiday of Easter was incorporated into the Roman Catholic Church at the Council of Nicaea in 325 AD; whereby this practice then started to permeate and leaven many other branches of Christianity.

We will also be looking at Easters close ties to Pagan goddess known as Ishtar and the specific associations and practices of Easter like:
